

## Text 28 Proposition de traduction

From Tuesday 1(st) November onwards/ As of / As from Tuesday November 1 (st)/ with effect from Tuesday 1(st) November, those who will apply for British citizenship/anyone/ any person making application to obtain British nationality/ (all/any) applicants for British citizenship/ for naturalisation as a British citizen must take a computerised 45-minute maximum test/ a computerised test of 45 minutes maximum. The test is compulsory/ obligatory/ mandatory except for applicants who chose to attend combined English language (ESOL) and basic citizenship classes/ to attend English language courses that include learning information about life in the UK. Applicants must answer 18 questions correctly out of a total of 24 to pass. Those who fail are allowed to retake / re-sit the test as many times as necessary for £ 34. for a long time naturalisation was granted after merely/ simply filling out a form. Since February 2004 the new British citizens have sworn/ pledged allegiance to the Crown/ the Queen and proclaimed their loyalty to the state/ the British establishment during a public or private formal citizenship ceremony. As the government sees it, this is all about insisting that getting a British passport is a personal choice involving/ entailing/ that includes/ along with rights and duties to prove a true wish to integrate into the United Kindgom. Approximately 141,000 people were granted British citizenship/ British nationality last year / Some 141,000 people obtained official citizenship in the UK last year/ acquired UK citizenship last year.
